<u>Presenter</u>: Nancy Movall, BlendEd/EdReady Implementation Coordinator, ESUCC-EdReady, a quality instructional Resource.

**Overview:** Nancy Movall explained that EdReady NE is a result of a collaboration between ESUCC and NDE. EdReady NE is a personalized learning program to help students detect gaps in their readiness for math and english. The five uses of EdReady are to:

- Supplement student skills while taking a math or English Language Arts class
- Revisit possible gaps in general math or language arts skills
- Practice math or language arts skills needed for desired career path
- Prepare for upcoming local math or English Language Arts classes or curriculum
- Minimize "summer learning loss"

EdReady NE is free to K-12 students across the state as supplemental education. The student begins by taking an assessment which creates a study path. The teacher can then monitor the student's achievement.

# <u>Presenter</u>: Craig Hicks, ESU #13 tech staff - Nebraska Cloud Portal and Digital Content- Single Sign-on

**Overview:** Craig gave a presentation on Nebraska Cloud Portal and digital content with a single sign on. With so many valuable educational applications, remembering usernames and passwords for each of them has become a problem for teachers and students. Now, this portal allows a district to have one log-in to view applications that the district uses instead of going to each application individually. This portal can be customized to fit each district. This is a statewide environment that is also connected to the new ADVISER state reporting system.

## Presenter: Lori Biesecker, ESU #13 tech staff - Make G Suite Work For You

**Overview:** Over 50 million teachers and students around the world use G Suite for Education. G Suite is a package of cloud-based services that can provide your school with a whole new way to work together online—not just using email and chat, but over video conferences, social media, real-time document collaborations, and more.

In order for students to have a competitive edge, they need to know how to leverage the power of these digital tools. It is important for teachers to be able to use these tools to their fullest potential. Lori demonstrated the use of Add-ons and Extensions to use in Google Chrome. After uploading the add-ons, they will show in the toolbar. A few of her favorites are: Grammarly, Adbloc Plus and Bit.ly. G Suite training is a helpful tool if you forget how to insert, add graphics or need help with formulas. Using Team Drives is a good solution to manage district data.

Lori is available to meet with teachers on an individual basis to help set up a Google account that best fits their needs.

## Presenter: B.J. Peters, ESU #13 tech Director and Annie Mumgaard, UNL State Museum on Virtual Field Trips

**Overview:** Virtual field trips allow students to explore places that they might not have been able to visit otherwise. Elementary school students especially benefit from virtual field trips since their school trips are often limited by distance and time constraints. Students of all ages can experience traveling to far-off locations -- from Antarctica to outer space -- through a virtual trip. And we will have an actual connection to a remote location. All you need is a computer, projection system and an internet connection.

Annie was at the UNL State Museum and demonstrated how the virtual field trip works.
